Clarification about Disabled Parking at Heatherlie

Please note - all Heatherlie Residents & Visitors Only: the Disabled car park notice that stands at the top of the angle parks between the Uniting Church and Heatherlie (see photo at right), this stipulates 1P, with the time limit of 1 hour parking. Unfortunately, residents/visitors cannot park in that spot all day.

Only a blue disabled permit (category 1), can use this bay; not the green permit (category 2). The blue disabled permit does not get double time in a signed disabled bay; it only gets double time (2 hours) if displaying a blue permit in a standard bay of a public carpark.

All disabled parking is free (both on and off street) with the time limits applied.

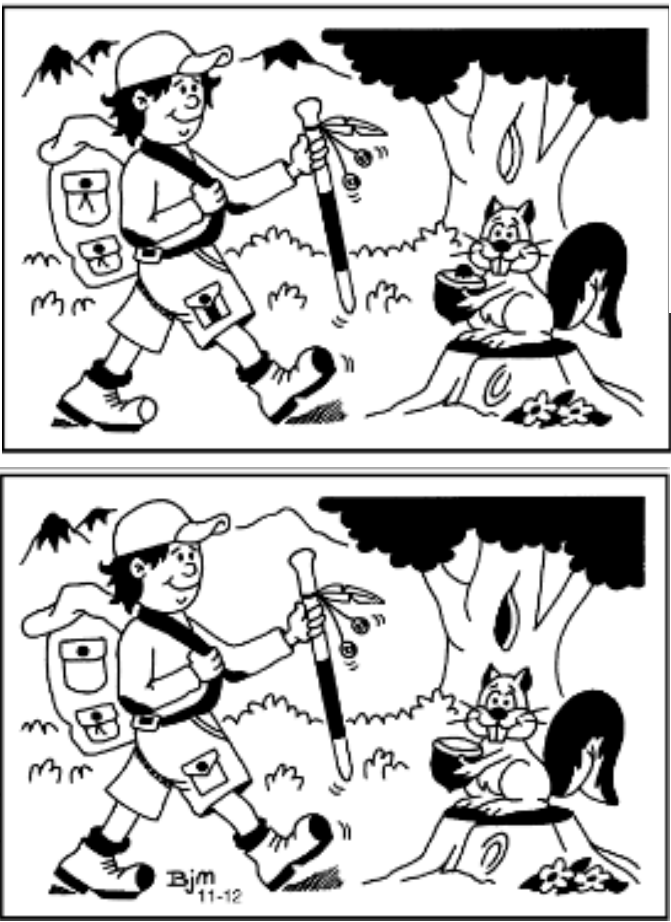


HEX WORD PUZZLE
