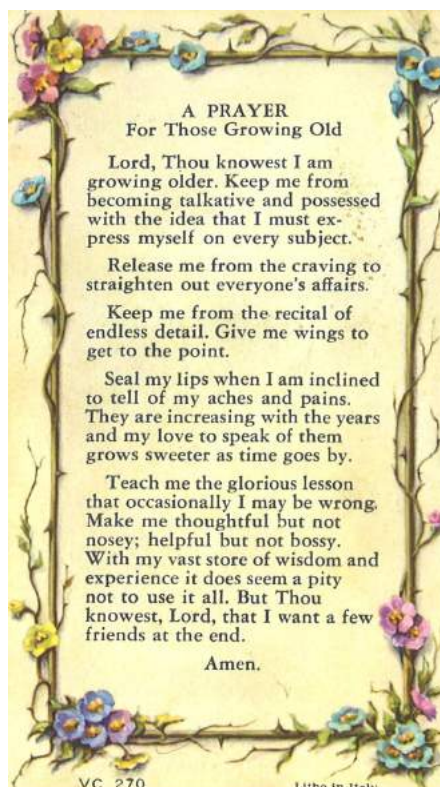
the mess left by unrinsed tins and containers.
