Personal Alarm Reminder

There are many residents in Heatherlie with safety alarms. There are many different types of alarms, most common is Me Pac, Live life or Safety Link Me Pac gives cover inside the unit and within a certain range around Heatherlie. Live life can be worn anywhere, as it is connected to Bluetooth. Safety link has a limited range also.

Most accidents happen within your unit and when you are on your own. If you fall when out and about there will always be someone to come to your aid.

I have live life alarm and have had for many years. I don't have a health issue but I feel safe and secure wearing it. Another advantage is that if someone comes to your door and frightens you, press the alarm and help will be on the way. Occasionally I will take it off if I am wearing something fancy and going out with friends but the moment, I enter my unit it goes on.

If you fall somewhere in the unit, it is no use having the alarm on the bench. When showering, leave on again (it is no good on the sink), even in the recliner chair with your feet up, if you take a turn, it's no good other than on you. A good tip at night is getting a big safety pin or I have a nappy pin (I have from bygone days), thread the pin through the alarm and pin to night attire. This keeps it in place all night and you get a better sleep. No good again sitting on the dressing table or side table away from arms reach.

Going to the toilet in middle of the night can be a hazard as I for one am tottery at whatever time nature calls.

So! wearing the alarm is for your safety and it gives peace of mind to your family.
